Statement of Confirmation Adapted From the Hungarian Unitarian Catechism

Congregant: I BELIEVE AND CONFESS!

Minister: Do you believe, that human beings led by God's Spirit, following Jesus' example can accomplish the Kingdom of God here on earth?

Minister: Do you believe, that your Unitarian Christian faith, which during the history made great sacrifices and reached outstanding results, proclaims clearly the Gospel according to Jesus, the religion to love God and your fellow (neighbor), the final goal of our life: the completeness, the perfection?

Minister: If you believe, do you promise and pledge that you will remain faithful for ever (until the end of your life) to God, to the teachings of Jesus and to your Unitarian church?
